For each question, complete the second sentence with no more than three words so that it means the same as the first.

1. I prefer listening to music to watching TV.
I like listening to music *more than* watching TV.
2. TV has too much advertising.
TV has *too many* adverts.
3. There are only a few good programmes on TV.
There aren't *many* good programmes on TV.
4. I haven't watched TV for ages.
It's been a long time *since* I watched TV.
5. If I don't buy some new music every month, I get bored with my collection.
I get bored with my collection *unless* I buy some new music every month.
6. Why don't you stay in and watch TV this evening?
If I were you, I *would* in and watch TV this evening.
7. They have a lot of repeats on TV.
There *are* a lot of repeats on TV.
