Present Simple Passive

Everyone says that another pandemic is inevitable.

SAID

One more pandemic (1) is said to (1) be inevitable.

In most experts' opinions, aliens exist extremely far away and so cannot contact us. THOUGHT

Aliens are thought to (1) exist too (1) far away to be able to contact us.

Present Continuous Passive

At present, construction of the new palace is underway on the outskirts of the city. CURRENTLY

The new palace is currently (1) being constructed (1) on the outskirts of the city.

Past Simple Passive

Hundreds of ceremonies took place when the festival was on.

WERE

Several hundred ceremonies (1) were held during (1) the festival.

Past Continuous Passive

At that moment, the conductor of the orchestra was a young child.

BEING

At that moment, the orchestra was being (1) conducted by (1) a young child.

Present Perfect Passive

We have postponed the conference and it will now take place in 2031.

PUT

The conference <u>has been put (1) off until (1)</u> 2031.

Past Perfect Passive

Before that, there was a blockage in the pipe caused by cooking fat.

BEEN

The pipe had been (1)/ blocked by (1) cooking fat.

Future Passive

Permission for us to knock down the castle is due soon.

GIVEN

We will be given (1) permission to (1) knock down the castle soon.



Passive infinitive

In those days, our campaign had the support of a team of five people.

ΒE

Our campaign used to be (1) supported by (1) a team of five people.

Modals plus passive

I'm sure my dad put those valuable old comics in the bin.

THROWN

Those valuable old comics must have been (1) thrown away (1) by my dad.

Steve definitely didn't climb that wall.

HAVE

That wall <u>can't have (1) been climbed (1)</u> by Steve.

Passive Present Participle

Every rat loves it if you tickle it under the chin.

BEING

All rats love (1) being tickled (1) under the chin.
